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How do we Celebrate *Eid al-Fitr?*



Eid al-Fitr is not just a celebration—it's a reward for a month of devotion.

The Prophet ﷺ said:

"For the fasting person, there are two joys: one at the time of breaking his fast, and the other when he meets his Lord."

(Bukhari, Muslim)

This Eid is that first joy. After days of fasting, long nights in prayer, and hearts full of du'a, we celebrate—not because Ramadan is over, but because Allah allowed us to witness it. The Sahabah would ask Allah for six months to accept their Ramadan. That's the mindset we carry: hope and humility. And yet, joy too—because Eid is a sign of His mercy.

- Don't forget reverts or those without family nearby—invite them, include them.

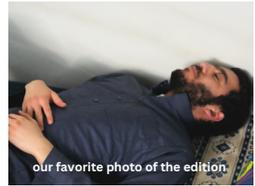

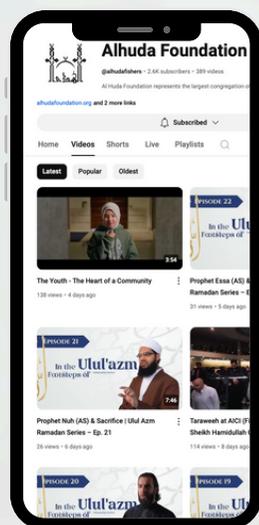
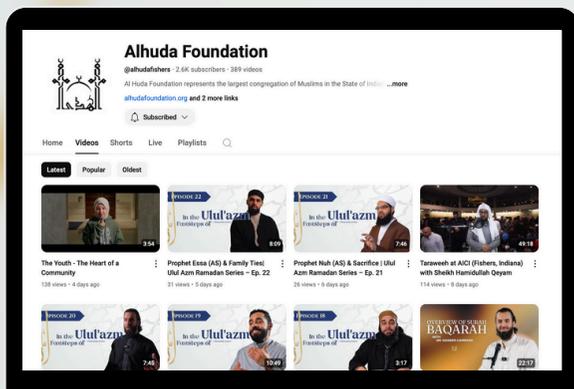
