Purifying intentions

Every journey in Islam begins with intention. Before action, before planning, before outcomes – there is the heart.

The Prophet ﷺ said:

"إِنَّمَا الْأَفْعَالَ يَالْبَيْنَاتِ"

"Actions are judged by intentions." (Bukhari & Muslim)

This hadith is not only the first hadith in Sahih al-Bukhari, but it is also the first hadith in the 40 Nawawi hadiths. The scholars intentionally placed it at the beginning to remind us that nothing that follows has value without sincerity.

Allah tells us that deeds without the right intention hold no weight:

﴿وَقَدْرُمَا إِلَى مَا عَمِلُوا مِنْ عَمَلٍ فَجَعَلْنَاهُ فَبَأْءَ فَنَثَرْزَ﴾

"And We will turn to whatever deeds they did, and We will make them scattered dust." (Al-Furqan 25:23)

As we begin a new year, it is easy to focus on goals, plans, and results. But Islam teaches us to begin elsewhere – with intention. A sincere intention can turn ordinary actions into worship, and small deeds into lasting reward.

The Prophet ﷺ said:

"مَنْ هُمْ بِحَسَنَةٍ فَلَمْ يَعْمَلُهَا كُتُبَتْ لَهُ حَسَنَةٌ كَامِلَةٌ"

"Whoever intends a good deed but does not do it, it is written for him as a complete good deed."

(Bukhari & Muslim)

Even when the action falls short, the intention is never lost with Allah.

You may strive, serve, give, teach, or improve yourself this year and never see the results you hoped for. But Allah does not measure success the way we do. He looks at sincerity, effort, and truthfulness of the heart.

So as this year begins, renew your niyyah – not just for big goals, but for every step along the way.

اللَّهُمَّ اجْعِلْ أَعْمَالَنَا خَالِصَةً لِوَجْهِكَ الْكَرِيمِ

O Allah, make our actions sincerely for Your sake.
