- ✓ Seek forgiveness and make lots of du'a.


Iman means fasting because Allah commanded it, and Ihtisab means seeking only His reward. So, let's roll up our sleeves and make this Ramadan count!

RAMADAN MASJID RULES

As we welcome the blessed month of Ramadan, we want to ensure that everyone—children, parents, and all attendees—has a safe, peaceful, and enjoyable experience at the masjid. To help us achieve this, we are introducing a few important guidelines regarding children, prayer spaces, and facility use during Taraweeh prayers.

These rules are designed to keep our masjid clean, organized, and safe for everyone, while allowing families to fully benefit from their time in worship. We kindly ask for your cooperation and support in following these guidelines:

- Children under 14 must be accompanied by a parent at all times in the masjid.
- Children ages 4-10 must go to the Eman School building, where activities are provided, or pray next to a parent.
- The gym will open after the first 4 rak'at of Taraweeh. Children 11 and up may go to the gym at that time under the supervision of volunteers.
- Babysitters will watch children ages 1-3 in the kids' room while mothers pray there.
- The masjid will close at 11:00 PM sharp.
